Seniors must be less than 19 years of age as of December 31st, 2018

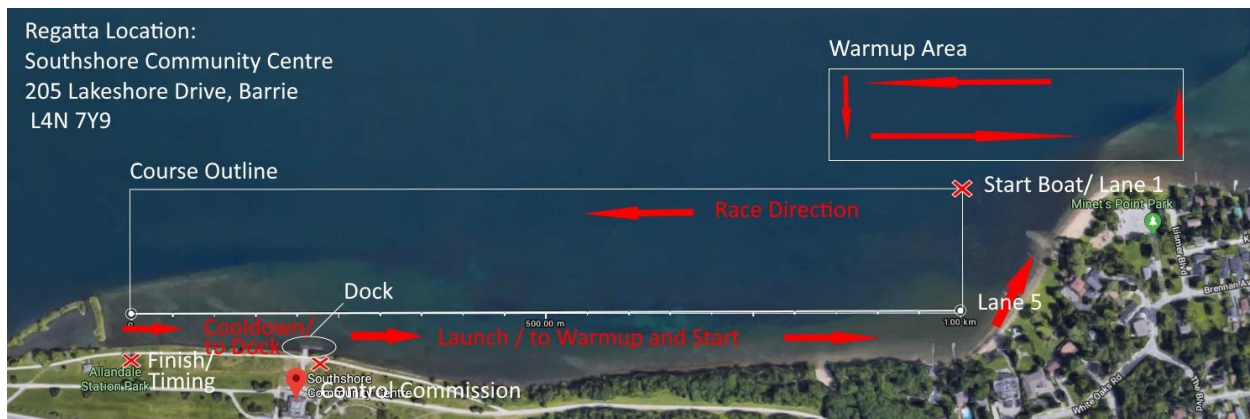
Event Breakdown

Coaches meeting	- 7:00 am
Umpires meeting	- 7:30 am
Boats start launching	- 8:00 am
First race of the day	- 8:30 am
Lunch Break	- 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm
Awards	- 3:00 pm – 3:20 pm

Please make sure your athletes are aware of all the necessary rules of racing including following Umpire commands and how “Quick Starts” work. Please check that your boats have secure bow balls, proper heel straps/ties and a bow marker holder. They **will** be inspected at the control commission before being allowed on the water.

The course is a roughly buoyed course with markers approximately every 150 meters. The start will be a floating start approximately 800m East of the dock; the finish line is West of the dock. Crews wishing to use the warm up area must pass through the start area, keeping as far east as is safely possible, so as not to interfere with crews getting ready to start their races.

Hot Seating

We don't have an additional hot seating dock so all transitions will be made at the main dock. Please have a coach present at the dock when a switch is being made to ensure a safe and speedy change over. Hot seating will only be permitted for races that have a 3 race gap. If you are not able to accommodate all your crews due to a lack of equipment please ask regatta organizers if host club equipment is available. Please make every effort to reduce the amount of equipment changes and adjustments on the dock.

Trailing

All trailers must be parked in the parking lot. There is ample parking in the East end of the lot or on the road for personal vehicles. Road parking is by permit only; lot parking is pay or permit parking.

IMPORTANT NOTICE:

The City of Barrie has implemented a paid parking policy throughout all lakeshore parking lots. All lot parking is now paid. We are attempting to obtain permits for boat carrying vehicles. When submitting your entries please submit a license plate number for the trailer towing/ boat carrying vehicle. No vehicles are to be parked on the grass.

Municipal Law enforcement may issue tickets to anyone who has not submitted their plate number/ obtained a permit from the BRC. They were out ticketing last year - no reason to expect that they will not do the same in 2018.

Race Schedule

The event list is below. We will follow the schedule as closely as possible. These events are staggered to try to alleviate pressure on boats and athletes. We will race 5 boats at a time. Times will be recorded and event placement will be determined by time for events with more than one heat.

Race Announcements using Twitter

As in the past, the Barrie Rowing Club will have a P/A system which we will use to call crews to the start line. However, because the City of Barrie has added to the western end of the parking lot, some trailers are going to be further from the P/A system than in the past, making it difficult to hear announcements. To mitigate this problem, we will be

using Twitter to call crews to the start as well as the P/A system. Note that it is the coach/ crew's responsibility to show up in a timely fashion at the Control Commission.

Entries

Due to changes in the way Rowing Canada and RowOntario operate (by now requiring a \$5.50 fee per seat raced), we can no longer offer a flat fee structure. Instead, entry fees are based on the type of boat(s) each athlete is racing in, for each boat entered. Registration and payment are handled through Regatta Central.

Fees for this event are structured on a per-boat basis, as follows:

Boat Class	Fee (payable online to RegattaCentral) Does not include Rowing Canada and RowOntario seat fees (\$5.50 per seat)
1x - Single	25.00
2x - Double	35.00
4x - Quad	40.00
4+ - Coxed Four	40.00
8+ - Coxed Eight	60.00

Protests

Protests will be handled according to the Rules of Racing, section 10.15, specifically:

A protest must be made in writing to the Chief Umpire not later than one hour after the Race Umpire has communicated his/her ruling regarding the objection or, in the case of disputing the published results, one hour after the results have been published. The following may lodge a protest:

1. A crew that has raised an objection on the race course, or, before leaving the finish area of the race course.
2. A crew whose objection has been rejected.
3. Crews affected by the acceptance of the objection.
4. A crew disputing the published results, however any such dispute cannot be related to a matter which should have been raised by a crew as an objection.

The protest shall be accompanied by deposit of \$100.00 Canadian. Deposits can be received by cash, certified cheque, bank draft, money order or credit card where available. The deposit shall be refunded if the protest or appeal is allowed. The Board of the Jury shall decide if the protest was justified. It will make its decision before the next round of races in the event concerned, and, in any case, no later than two hours after the last race of the day.

Uniforms

With only a roughly buoyed course we require that all crews be sure they are supplied with a bow marker (supplied at the control commission), and their school colors or uniforms are clearly visible. We encourage crews to have fun with their racing outfits but ask that they are tasteful and that they are distinguishable by the other teams and umpires.

Points

Overall Barrie High School Sprints Trophy will go to the team that accumulates the most points. Please note: events with less than 3 entries may be run with another event but will not count towards total points.

First Place = 3 points, Second Place = 2 points, Third Place = 1 point.

All Clubs that wish to participate must register the number of athletes & Boat entries that will be attending by Tuesday June 5th @ 9pm through the online registration system. Entries after this time will be allowed but may be assessed a higher fee. Preliminary draws will be sent out no later than 5pm Wednesday June 6th.

Extra draws will be available at the coaches' meeting on Saturday morning. Please check the draw for crew conflicts (same person in two races less than three races apart). We may be able to make changes and additions at the event at the coaches' meeting. No guarantees that we will do so, so please check crew rosters against the schedule. We will do our best to accommodate any request. Our priority is giving athletes a quality racing experience.
